2. Staff Report

a. Monthly Totals

There were no questions or comments from the board members so Member Hastings went on to talk about Vet Services.

b. Vet Services

Member Hastings discussed the budget Animal Services has for vet care at the shelter. The year to date expenditures was covered with a breakdown of vaccines that are provided for the animals. Pros and cons of heartworm testing dogs at the adoption center were also discussed as well as the possibility to charge for surrenders or adoptions to help supplement the Animal Care Fund. It was suggested that the members think about possible fundraising ideas to help increase the funds available in the Animal Care Fund.

c. Event List

Member Hastings went over the events that Animal Services has been and is going to be involved in throughout the year. Member Hastings added that there may be more added as the year progresses.

d. Volunteer Program Update

Member Hastings gave an update of the “Partner for Paws” program. The volunteer program is now open to the public after being put on hold for approximately a year. Animal Services is hoping the program will grow to include long term dedicated volunteers that can help the center with events and fundraising. The program currently has 12 volunteers with about 4 members that volunteer regularly. Member Hastings encouraged the board members to read over the volunteer S.O.P.s that were included in the packet and provide feedback.

Member O’Meara encouraged viewers and members to share with others about the volunteer program and talked about the benefits to the animals with having a strong volunteer base.

Animal Adoption Center Play Yard Expansion Update

A resident donated \$15,000 dollars to Animal Services with the stipulation that it would benefit not only the animals but also the staff. The staff voted on several items and a play yard expansion and picnic tables was at the top of the list.

The donation was used to create a new outdoor space with an eight-foot fence, complete with coyote rollers (which keeps wildlife out and pets in) on the east side of the building, more than tripling the current outdoor play area at approximately 8800 square feet. The new play yard is lush with native shade trees, natural grasses, and plenty of room for pets to run off-leash while awaiting adoption. In total the project cost \$17,000 with the excess funded by the Animal Care Fund, which is comprised of donated monies. Not only is this upgrade benefiting the health and stimulation of pets staying at the Adoption Center, it costs the tax payers nothing.

Description

Under direct supervision, responsible for the maintenance of all animal habitats, to include cleaning all habitats; feeding, walking and bathing animals; cleaning laundry and dishes. Coordinates the overall operation of the volunteer and community outreach programs. Point of contact with citizens and adoption program.

Examples of Duties

- Responsible for the daily, on-going and as need basis cleaning of all animal habitats.
- Responsible for conducting animal adoption interviews, paperwork and follow-ups.
- Responsible for the general care of animals, e.g., feeding, cleaning kennels, walking and grooming.
- Assists the general public in directional and procedural inquiries.
- Develops and coordinates community outreach efforts including, but not limited to, fundraisers, off-site adoption events, foster care, transportation, representation of Animal Services at community events and educational endeavors. Maintains the Animal Services website and social media sites.
- Recruits, trains and organizes volunteers. Prepares and maintains regular volunteers' activity reports. Regularly reviews the volunteer policies and procedures while working with the Manager to keep the program current with community needs.
- Develops and provides volunteer orientation meetings. Leads volunteers in identifying high priority tasks and following through to make sure all daily, weekly and monthly tasks are completed.
- Assists the Manager with hiring and separations decisions. Assist with volunteer appreciation events.
- Develops programs that will reduce the rate of euthanasia such as networking with outside agencies to increase animal placement, enhance their image in order to make them more attractive to potential adopters.
- Works with other departments to develop and coordinates promotions for adoptable animals. Networks with other agencies to help place pets in rescues.
- Operates various types of office equipment.
- Informs supervisor of all work activities.
- Adheres to departmental, personnel, and safety policies and procedures.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications

- A High School Diploma or General Equivalency Diploma (GED) is required.
- One year of experience working in volunteer relations or two years of experience as a volunteer.
- Must possess a valid Texas driver's license and driving record must be in compliance with Town policy.

Desired Qualifications

- Must have a general working knowledge of computer operations (data entry) and general office procedures.
- Must have excellent English communicative skills, both oral and written, to include spelling, grammar, and punctuation.
- Bilingual communicative skills preferred.
