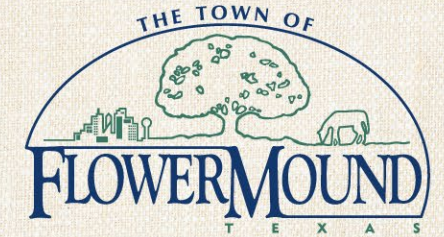

Roll of barbed Wire found by Bob Rheudasil in Flower Mound on Holford's Prairie. Wire appears to be from 1878 (third US Patent). It would be among the first (if not the first) "Devil Wire" strung on this prairie. Range Wars ensued afterwards.
