J. CONSENT ITEM(S)

This part of the agenda consists of non-controversial or "housekeeping" items required by law. Items may be removed from Consent by any council member by making such request prior to a motion and vote.

1. Minutes - 2/16 - Consider approval of the minutes from a Town Council Regular Meeting; Town of Flower Mound Fire Control, Prevention, and Emergency Medical Services District Special Meeting; and Crime Control and Prevention District Special Meeting held on February 16, 2026.
2. Flatbed Sign Cutter Purchase - Consider approval of the purchase of the Apex PLUS 2516 Flatbed Sign Cutter in the amount of \$69,500.00 from BC Graphics, LLC.
3. PSA - Traffic Signal Design 2026 - Consider approval of a Professional Services Agreement with Kimley Horn and Associates, Inc., to provide traffic signal designs for the Flower Mound Road at Quail Run Road Traffic Signal (S-9); FM 1171 at Luther Signal Reconstruction; and Mckamy Creek at Old Settlers Pedestrian Safety Improvement projects in the amount of \$103,000.00; and authorization for the Mayor to execute same on behalf of the Town
4. Furst Ranch Phase 1 Development Agreement - Consider approval of a Development Agreement with 1171 Commercial NE, LLC for the construction of certain Master Planned Town Roadway and Utility improvements associated with the Furst Ranch development, in the amount of \$22,168,915.20.
5. Frontier Internet Upgrades - Consider approval of three (3) Service Agreements with Frontier Communications of America, Inc for upgraded and new internet connectivity, in the amount of \$224,700 over five (5) years.

1. FM2499 / FM3040 Intersection Improvements - Consider approval of a Construction Agreement with 2L Construction LLC, for the FM 2499 at FM 3040

- Intersection Improvements project, in the amount of \$2,820,681.50; and authorization for the Mayor to execute the same on behalf of the Town.
2. SSP25-0006 - Havenwood Phase 1 - Consider a request for a Subdivision Site Plan (SSP25-0006 – Havenwood, Phase 1) to develop a residential subdivision with an exception to Section 90-403, “Fully developed FEMA floodplain,” and an exception to Section 90-404, “Special flood hazard area (FEMA floodplain),” of the Code of Ordinances to allow construction-related activity within the Fully Developed and FEMA floodplain areas. The property is generally located south of Cross Timbers Road, east of Shiloh Road and west of Scenic Road. (PZ recommended approval by a vote of 6 to 0 at its February 23, 2026, meeting.)
 3. TRP25-0011 - Havenwood Phase 1 - Public Hearing to consider an application for a tree removal permit (TRP25-0011) for three (3) specimen trees on the property known as Havenwood Phase 1 for the proposed conservation development. The property is generally located south of Cross Timbers Road, east of Shiloh Road, and west of Scenic Drive. (The Environmental Conservation Commission recommended approval of the three (3) trees by a vote of 5 to 1 at its February 3, 2026, meeting.)
 4. SP25-0019 - Forestwood Middle School Track Replacement - Public Hearing to consider a request for a site plan (SP25-0019 – Forestwood Middle School Track Replacement) to redevelop an outdoor athletic area, with an exception to Section 82-302, “Compatibility buffer,” of the Code of Ordinances. The property is generally located east of Morriss Road and southeast of Garden Road. (PZ recommended approval by a vote of 6 to 0 at its February 23, 2026, meeting.)
 5. TRP25-0009 - Forestwood Middle School Track Replacement - Public Hearing to consider an application for a tree removal permit (TRP25-0009) for fifteen (15) specimen trees on the property known as Forestwood Middle School for the proposed track replacement. The property is generally located east of Morriss Road and southeast of Garden Road. (The Environmental Conservation Commission postponed this item by a vote of 6 to 0 at its February 3, 2026, meeting. The Environmental Conservation Commission recommended approval of the fifteen (15) trees by a vote of 6 to 0 at its February 12, 2026, special meeting.)
 6. LDR25-0003 - 2025 State Legislative Updates - Public Hearing to consider an ordinance amending the Land Development Regulations (LDR25-0003 – 2025 State Legislative Updates) by amending Chapter 34, “Environment” of Subpart A “General Ordinances” and Chapter 78, “Administration” and Chapter 98, “Zoning” of Subpart B “Land Development Regulations” related to notice and protest procedures, home occupation, land uses, and noise. (PZ recommended approval by a vote of 6 to 0 at its February 23, 2026, meeting.)
 7. LDR25-0004 - Parking Mitigation and Foundational Planting Update - Public Hearing to consider an ordinance amending the Land Development Regulations (LDR25-0004 – Parking Mitigation and Foundational Planting Update) by amending Chapter 74, “General Provisions” and Chapter 82, “Development Standards” related to definitions, parking mitigation, off-street parking, foundational planting, and parking area landscaping. (PZ recommended approval by a vote of 6 to 0 at its February 23, 2026, meeting.)
